# WHAT IS THE OMAHA INLAND PORT AUTHORITY

The OIPA is responsible for planning, facilitating, and developing the designated district. This includes public infrastructure and site improvements, carried out independently or in partnership with other entities.

#### **Key powers and responsibilities include:**

- Issuing Revenue Bonds to finance projects (Note: General Obligation Bonds are not permitted, and the State of Nebraska holds no liability for these bonds).
- Acquiring, owning, constructing, leasing, and selling both real estate and personal property.
- Entering into contracts necessary to support the district's development and operations.
- Charging fees to fund and maintain district operations.
- Securing funds through loans, grants, appropriations, and gifts from public agencies.

# WHAT IS THE OIPA COMMUNITY ADVISORY COMMITTEE

The Community Advisory Committee consists of nine members that include (a) at least two owners of residential property located within the inland port district, (b) at least two owners of businesses located within the inland port district, (c) a member of the city council of such city of the metropolitan class whose city council district is located within the inland port district, (d) a member of the Legislature whose legislative district is located within the inland port district, and (e) a youth representative or someone closely involved with youth in the community. A single member may satisfy more than one qualification described in subdivisions (6)(a) through (e) of this section.




